



ALPINE CHAMOIS, RED STAG AND MOUFLON HUNTING IN SLOVENIA

ACCOMMODATION IN COZY GUEST HOUSE

This family-run guesthouse is situated in a quiet rural area, about 15-30 minutes from the hunting grounds, and features traditional interiors and a relaxation area with spa facilities. All accommodation units have wooden furnishings and en-suite bathrooms with showers. The on-site restaurant serves traditional homemade specialities and a hearty breakfast. Finnish and infrared saunas, a Turkish bath and massages can be arranged at an extra charge. Guests can also relax on the communal terrace and use the barbecue. The famous Lake Bled is 30km away. Free parking on site.







HUNTING AREA

*The hunting days take place in one of the oldest natural parks in Europe, created at the beginning of the 20th century. The park covers an area of over 50,000 hectares of vast and enchanting forests, valleys carved deep into the rock, high mountain pastures and crystalline waters that flow from the slopes of the highest mountain (2800 metres) into rivers, lakes and streams. The forest covers two-thirds of the park's territory, covering valley floors, steep slopes and high plateaus. The most characteristic tree species are beech, spruce and larch. The largest larch in the park has a circumference of 422 cm and is 1050 years old. The fauna of the park is incredibly diverse, encompassing a wide range of animal species, from microscopic to relatively large mammals, found both in the water and on the land. 7,000 different species live in the park. This remarkable diversity is influenced by different climatic conditions, varied topography, geological foundations and a wide range of habitats. The most typical animal is the chamois (*Rupicapra rupicapra*). The red deer population is very abundant and there is also a good population of mouflon. The quality of the chamois, deer and mouflon trophies is good considering that these are mountain territories. The hunter must be ready to seize the opportunities that present themselves without focusing too much on the value of the trophy. He will return home happy with a memorable hunting experience and a nice trophy.*

HOW THE HUNT IS ORGANIZED

Chamois and mouflon hunting is a combination of stalking and still hunting. This means that the guest hunter moves into the hunting area with a professional hunter-guide and when they see game, they stand in a strategic place. The local professional hunter knows the area and the movements of the chamois very well. The organization of the hunt can be adapted to the physical condition of the guest. In particular, chamois can be hunted at high or medium altitude. Guest hunters must of course be equipped for hunting in the mountains. They will need robust footwear, appropriate clothing, a walking stick, a rucksack, a steady hand and good eyesight.























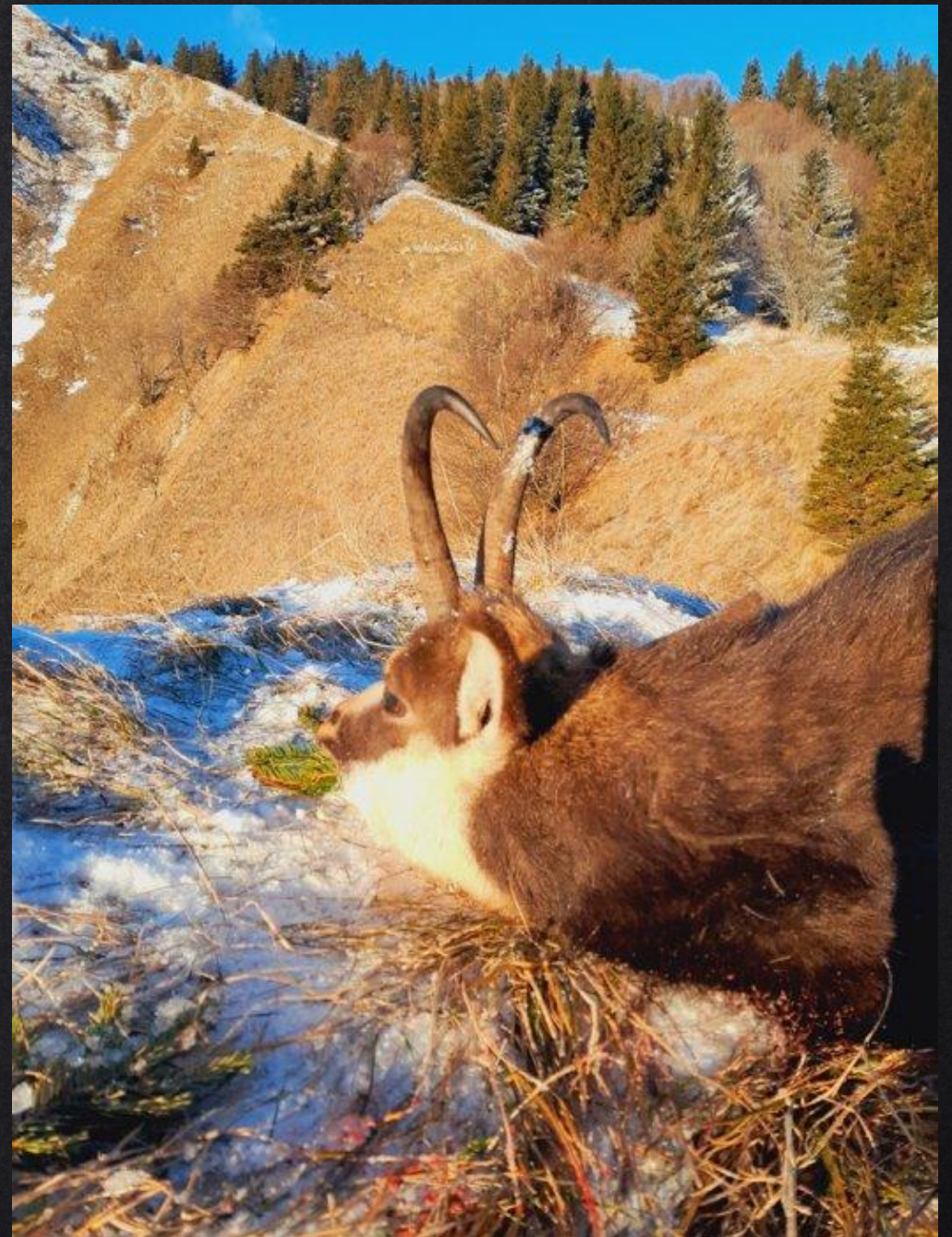

VISIT SLOVENIA

Slovenia, a green country, where the mountains meet the sea and Pannonian Basins. It offers wide green forests and charming towns. You will be surprised how on only 20 271 km² of land there can be such a natural, historical and architectural richness. Starting from the area the Bled lake where from the lake side you can admire the Alps peaks. On a tiny island in the middle of the lake there is the oldest Slovenian castle dating back to the 1004. As the capital of the Slovenian Alps is considered the town of Kranj with its charming historical center and rich cultural events calendar. Not to be missed is definitely the capital city, Ljubljana. Given its location it is very similar half to a Mediterranean town and half to Mittel Europe city such as Vienna or Prague. Its history dates back to the Roman empire period when the first village was settled in this area. Second biggest city of Maribor has a "shorter" history when the first written documents are dates to 1204, and both offer charming historical centers and vivid cultural life.

Slovenia is also rich in castles, manors, fortresses, and fortification systems. These were built at various times during the medieval, Renaissance, and Baroque periods, and the first traces of their construction date all the way back to antiquity.



SLOVENIAN GASTRONOMY

Food is an essential part of travel - and that's certainly true of Slovenia. For such a small country the variety of taste for a foodie is incredible. Alpine dishes are a total contrast to those found along the Adriatic coast, while foods in the Karst region and Pannonian Plain offer yet more flavours and cooking techniques. In the summer months there are myriad food festivals and open kitchens celebrating food in all its glory. Slovenia is particularly proud of its indigenous wines, some of which have become part of the protected geographical indication. Look out for teran, refošk, rebula and cviček. The black velvet grapevine (modra kavčina) is officially recognised as being more than 400 years old and is in the Guinness Book of Records as the oldest grapevine in the world, still producing its noble fruit.
