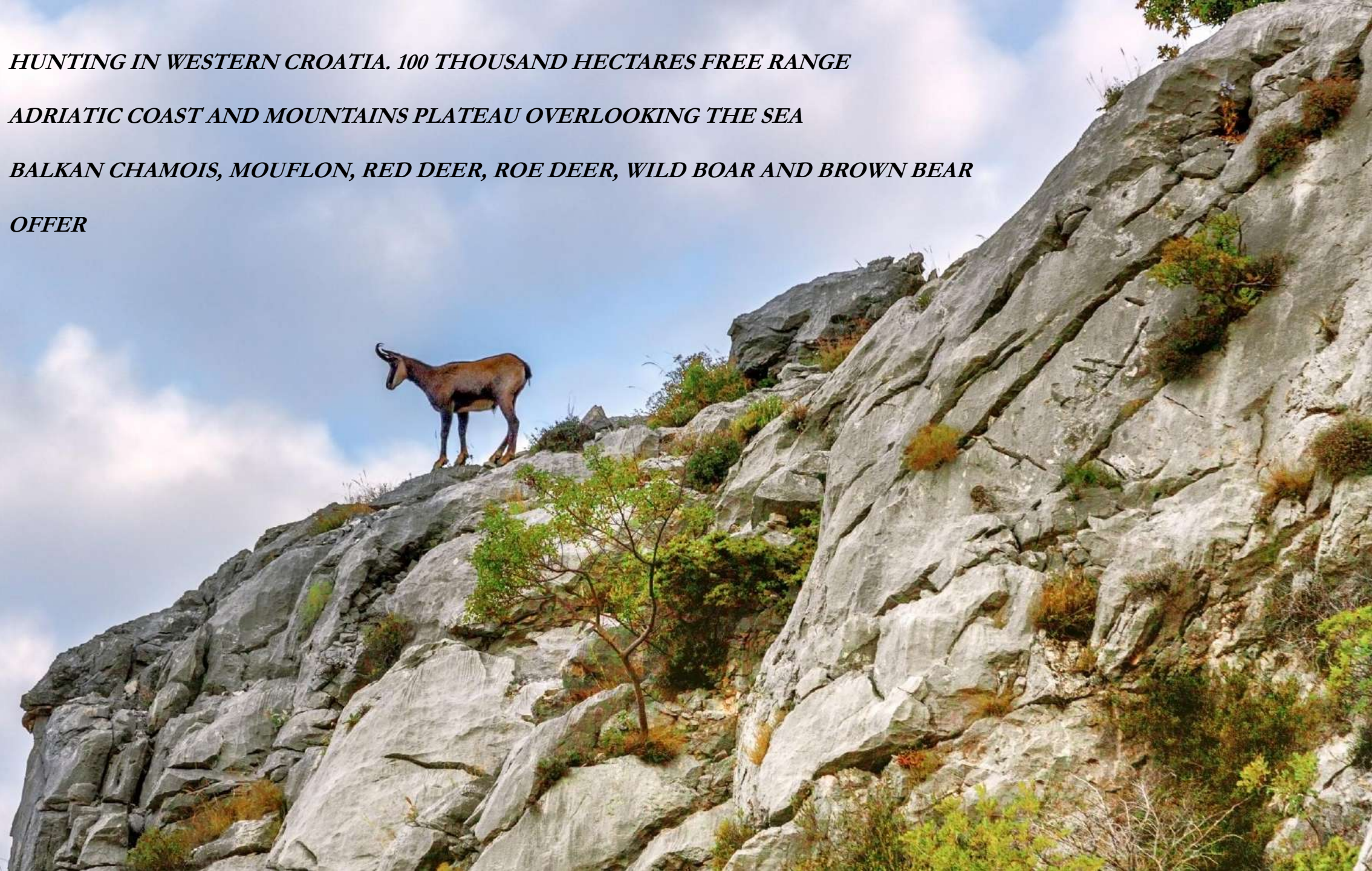

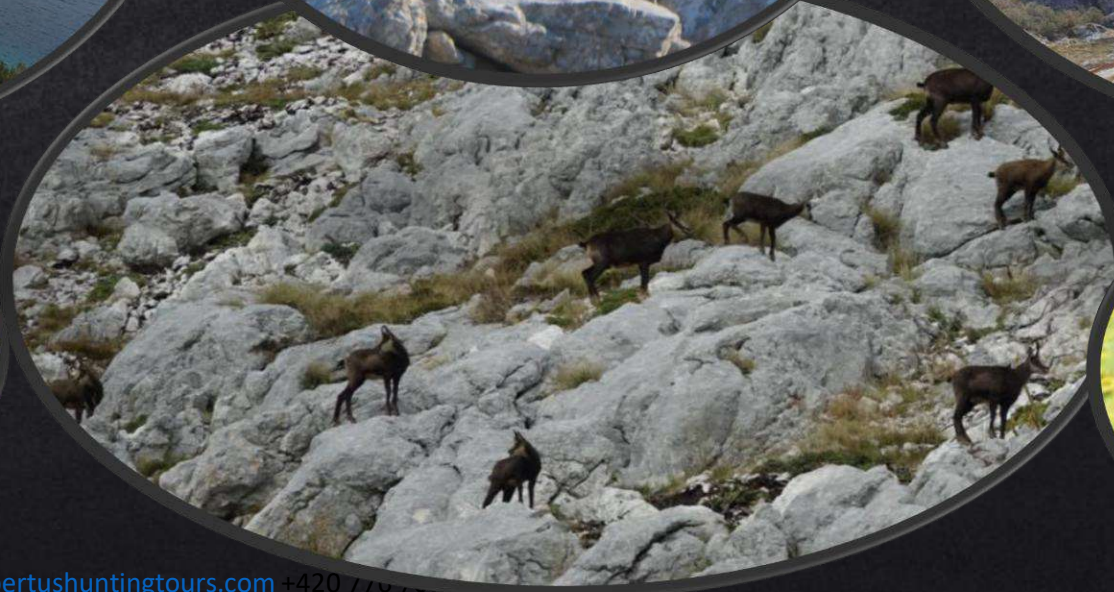

## HUNTING AREA N. 1

*This outstanding hunting area of approximately 12000 hectares is one of the most popular chamois hunting areas in Central and Eastern Europe. It is a very mountainous hunting ground with altitudes ranging from 380 to 1750 metres. It is an ideal habitat for chamois, mouflon and wild boar. First-class trophies of male chamois have made the area famous throughout the world. The abundance of game, the quality of the trophies, the harsh nature and the songs of the birds that inhabit this rocky area are the reasons why hunters return to this area time and again. The hunting area is an ideal place for families. Some members can enjoy the thrill of the sea while the hunters enjoy their hunt.*



















## HUNTING AREA N. 2

*This hunting area, sizing around 4000 hectares, is situated on a peninsula at an altitude of about 1000 metres above sea level. It is one of the most suitable natural habitats for mouflon in this part of Europe. As there are no roads in this area, visitors have to travel on hunting trails, assisted by draught animals that carry the equipment necessary for their stay in the hunting area. This is a challenge for true lovers of traditional hunting, who will approach a mouflon ram on a steep rock and, with luck, get a trophy over 230 CIC points. For this hunt, the hunters' accommodation is a mountain hut with an open fire and a view of the nearby islands, offering an unforgettable experience.*









### HUNTING AREA N. 3

*Located on the border of a famous national park, 150km to the south-west of Zagreb, the 18,000-hectare estate is a haven of peace and greenery with its centuries-old beech and fir forests. The area is rich in red deer, roe deer and wild boars, and boasts one of the best brown bear populations in Europe. Hunting red stag during the rutting season, waiting for a bear from a high seat and listening to the song of the capercaillie in the morning are experiences that will stay with you for a long time. It is possible to fish for salmon in some of the lakes in the area. Hunters are accompanied by professional staff and accommodation is available in comfortable hunting lodges in the area.*



## HUNTING AREA N. 4

*This incredible hunting area of around 30,000 hectares covers part of the highest mountains in Croatia (up to around 1,800 metres above sea level) and is rich in deer, wild boar, brown bear, snipe and quail. The ancient beech and fir forests are also home to wolf, lynx and capercaillie (all protected species). This area is located about 200 km southwest of Zagreb, not far from the Adriatic Sea. Hunting days are perfectly arranged by local professional guides, and hunters (and non-hunting guests) are accommodated in hunting lodges offering a high standard of service.*



## HUNTING AREA N. 5

*The hunting grounds covers an area of approximately 13,000 hectares and is largely covered by intact mountain forests of beech and fir, where there is a good population of brown bear, red deer, roe deer and wild boar. The natural beauty of the area amidst ancient forests and lakes usually leaves guests breathless.*



## HUNTING AREA N. 6

*The hunting ground is situated on the most beautiful mountain in Croatia, at an altitude of between 1200 and 1400 metres and sizes over 22 thousand hectares. The area is very rich in plant and animal species. The hunting ground includes indigenous forests of beech, fir and dwarf pine, with beautiful meadows and rocky areas. The hunting ground is inhabited by protected wolf, lynx and capercaillie. Hunttable games are brown bear, red deer, roe deer and wild boars.*

## HUNTING AREA-FREE RANGE N. 7

*This hunting ground sizing around 1200 hectares is located in the hinterland of Zadar and is covered with the typical Mediterranean vegetation, with man-made hunting paths and passages. An abundance of small game (hare, pheasant, partridge, quail, snipe), trained hunting dogs and mild Mediterranean climate will provide hunters with unforgettable nature and hunting experiences. After the hunt, hunters can enjoy sightseeing in the old historical town of Zadar and enjoy first class Dalmatian cuisine and excellent wines.*

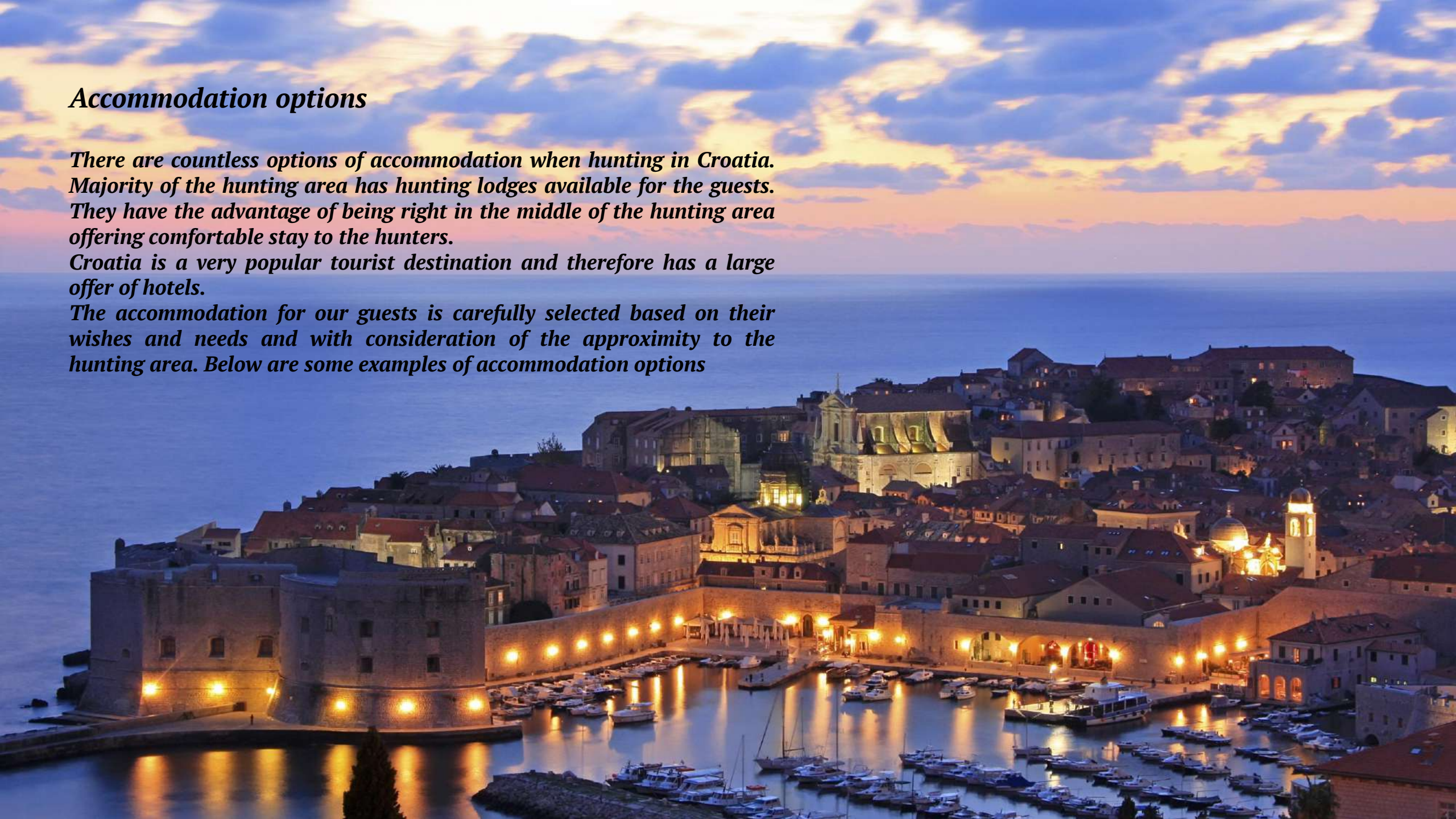


## ***Accommodation options***

***The accommodation for our guests is carefully selected based on their wishes and needs and with consideration of the proximity to the hunting area. Below are some examples of accommodation options***



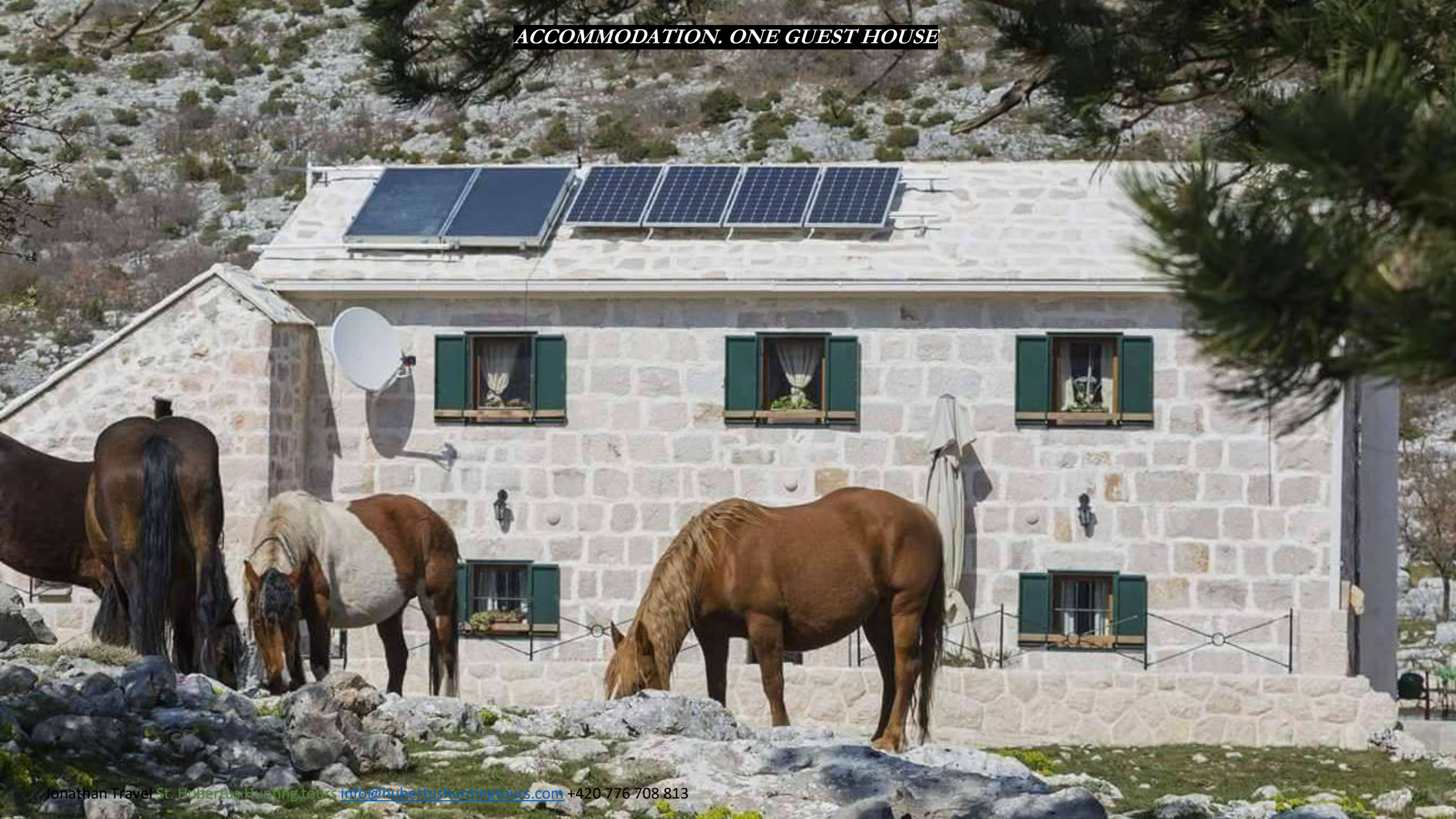

## ***VISIT CROATIA***

***Summarize the main tourist attractions of this, geographically speaking, small country is really a challenge. Croatia offers incredible natural beauties and architectonical gems divided by the mainland and many islands (there are 79 islands with the surface over 1 km<sup>2</sup> and over 500 smaller ones). One of the top sightseeing areas is the Krka natural park around the famous seven waterfalls. A part of these you will find there a well-preserved Franciscan monastery from the 15<sup>th</sup> century on a small island called Visovac. The best know national park in Croatia is without doubts the area of Plitvice lakes, listed on the Unesco list of world heritage. Especially in the spring this is a must to see.***

***Croatia boasts really a top location on the Adriatic sea side and has over 6000 km of the sea-side. The sea area is well-known for its variety and clean and incredibly transparent sea water. Together with the beautiful sea-side you admire the historical towns alongside such as Split. This second biggest town in Croatia has a history dating back to the second century before Christ when there was a Greek colony. The town itself was founded by Diocletianus, the Roman emperor, at the end of the 3<sup>rd</sup> century a.C. You will find a proof of this historical act visiting his palace with some well-preserved parts. More on south a must is the town of Dubrovnik with its historical center with tiny medieval streets.***

## ***The city of Zagreb***

***The capital city of Croatia and the nearest airport to the hunting area, is at 1 h and 20 min drive.***

***Zagreb has been the political, economic and cultural capital of Croatia since 1991. It is a city off the beaten track of mass tourism, concentrated mainly on the coast, but of disarming beauty. Its charms combine the best of Western and Eastern Europe. There is so much to do in Zagreb. The city is full of museums, galleries, theatres and palaces with Austro- Hungarian, Baroque and Art Nouveau architecture, as well as elegant restaurants, boutiques, shopping centres, pubs and trendy cafes.***

***It is not a city you will fall in love with at first sight, but it will slowly steal your soul. The Upper Town, Gornji grad, is home to the two oldest parts of the city, Kaptol and Gradec; below, 19th and 20th century palaces make up the Lower Town, Donji grad, a lively area with prestigious public buildings and 19th century palaces. Only three hours from the coast, Zagreb is an ideal starting point for exploring Croatia and its many lakes, such as the Jarun reservoirs to the south-west of the city, or its promontories, such as Mount Medvednica in the northern suburbs, which are easy to reach for a day out.***



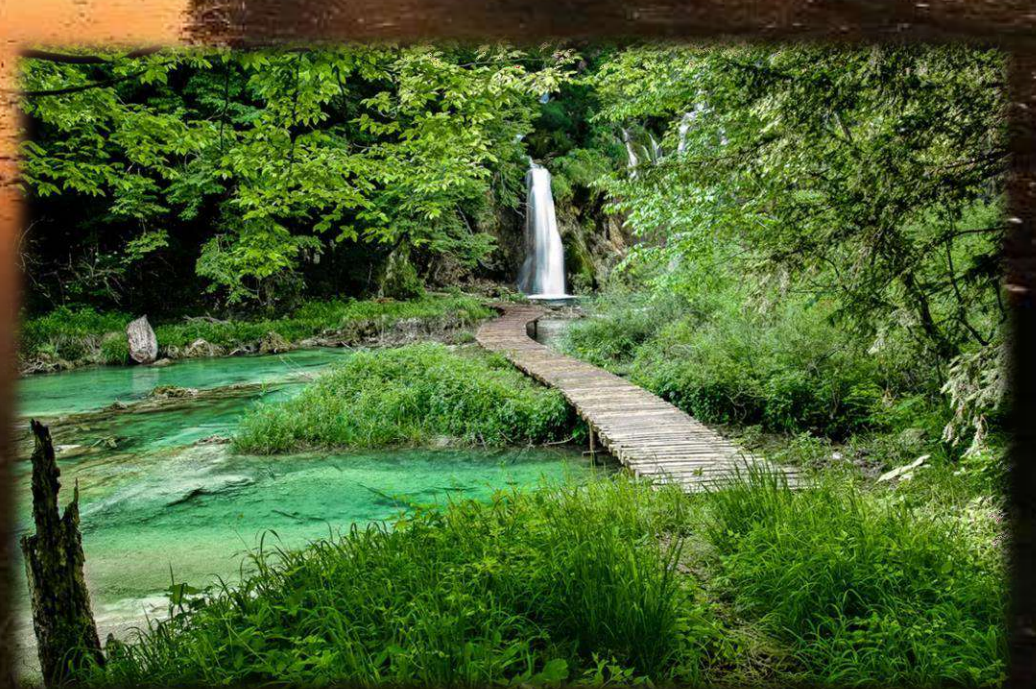
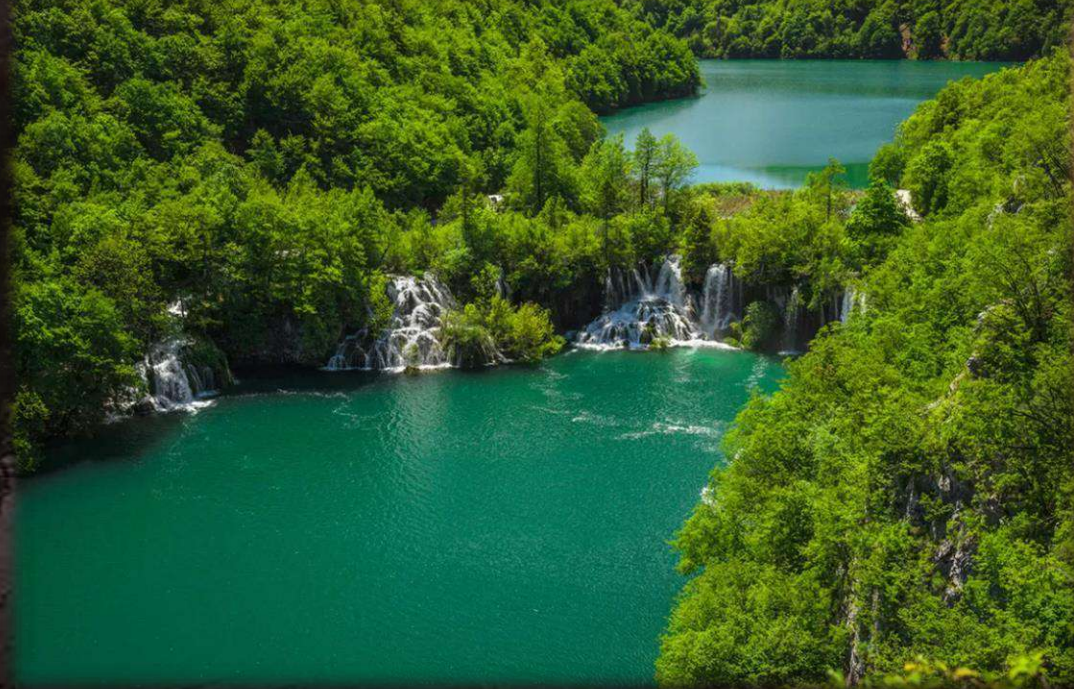
## *Plitvice lakes and cascades*


*One hour drive from the hotel you will be able to admire the beautiful area of Plitvice lakes and cascades.*

*Plitvice Lakes is the oldest and largest national park in the Republic of Croatia. The park is situated in the mountainous region of Croatia, between the Mala Kapela mountain range in the west and northwest, and the Lička Plješivica mountain range to the southeast.*

*The park is primarily covered in forest vegetation, with smaller areas under grasslands. The most attractive part of the park – the lakes – cover just under 1% of the total park area.*

*The lake system is comprised of 16 named and several smaller unnamed lakes, cascading one into the next. Due to the geological substrate and characteristic hydrogeological conditions, the lake system has been divided into the Upper and Lower lakes*





## ***Town of Ogulin***

***The hotel is located nearby the hunting area in a charming historical town of Ogulin.***

***The town of Ogulin is positioned in the very center of mainland Croatia, just between Zagreb and Rijeka. It was founded in a large valley formed by two rivers : Dobra and Zagorska Mrežnica.***

***Town's history dates back to the 15th century and wars the Ottoman Turks. The exact timing of the building of the Ogulin tower has not been established. However, a document issued by Bernardin Frankopan in his town of Modruš at around 1500 A.D. mentioned the borders between Modruš and Vitunj, and this is, at the same time, the first historical mention of Ogulin.***

***The Castle was built around 1500 above the gorge of the River Dobra – Đula's abyss. The founder of the town was Bernardin Frankopan, one of the mightiest noblemen of his time.***

***Today, the Castle houses The County Museum founded in 1967. It exhibits several collections of various kinds: archaeology, ethnology, old armaments, the memorial room of Ivana Brlić-Mažuranić (a renowned Croatian fairy-tale author), unique collection of mountaineering exhibits.***

***Ogulin is also known for witches of Klek. This mountain so inspired folk imagination that the locals created numerous ghoulish tales and legends about it. In the 17th century – the legend about the witches of Klek was first written down. This legend says that witches, fairies, and elves from all around the world gather in Klek during stormy nights. As they dance there their cries can be heard as far as Ogulin.***





## *Dubrovnik*

*Dubrovnik, often referred to as the 'Pearl of the Adriatic', is a historic Croatian city renowned for its well-preserved medieval architecture, its rich history, beautiful coastal scenery and lively cultural scene, which includes numerous festivals and events.*

## Croatian gastronomy

*The Croatian cuisine is specific for every region, reflecting the country's geography, history, and culture. The northern and southern areas of the Adriatic are characterized by the so called Mediterranean diet, that is considered to be one of the healthiest. Cheeses from Pag or Lika, "mišni sir" (cheese matured in a sheepskin bag) or Dalmatian and Istrian prosciutto are definitely to taste. Along the Adriatic coast you will feel the tradition of grilling and roasting fish and delicacies of the sea that has been carried down by generations. In the north of Croatia on the other hand the Austro-Hungarian culinary influences are more evident.*

*Together with the local dishes you will have to try their wine, the sunny climate of Croatia makes it very special. The kumbasice sausages from Skradin or Drnic prosciutto are to be eaten with a glass of Babic red wine from Primošten.*

## *Croatian game dishes*

*In Croatia you still find restaurants where you can taste venison in black soup, a delicacy from the superb cookery book of Count Nikola Zrinski. In addition to providing descriptions of numerous specialties of the time, this guide through fine cuisine is particularly inspired by dishes prepared with game. The nobility of the time enjoyed roast wild duck, medallions of venison, or game prosciutto. Many of the delicacies have been preserved through the years. On special festive occasions, the local folk will serve one of the most delectable dishes from the Count's cookery book: wild boar roasted in honey.*
