HUNTING IN SLOVENIA WITH ST. HUBERTUS HUNTING TOURS

We are proud to arrange your hunting days in the best Slovenian grounds with preserved nature and various flora and fauna. Slovenia boasts long-time hunting tradition and it is well-known for its biodiversity of plants and animal species. The area for hunting is more than 220,000 hectares, that means more than 10% of the total area of Slovenia. Our hunts take place in different natural environments and climates which can be found in Slovenia, from the High Karst Unit and the Alps, through the Pohorje highlands, to Dinaric setting and Pannonian Plain. You can find a description of two of these areas on the following pages. The nature in all these areas is among the best preserved in Europe and hunting there is of particular interest for all real hunters. For them, in addition to wild game also important is the authentic experience of game and other wildlife in their natural habitat. Trophy hunting tourism represents a part of the sustainable management of wildlife. Professional staff manage these grounds carefully in accordance with the principles of hunting ethics and their target is to protect and increase games' population. Hunting days are arranged by skilled professional hunters with a perfect knowledge of the grounds and games. The hunt is for red deer, fallow deer, roe deer, wild boar, mouflon, chamois, Alpine Ibex, marmot, brown bear. Guests from all over the world consider their hunting experience in Slovenia simply memorable and many of them are used to return to Slovenia with their families and friends.



HUNTING PERIODS ACCORDING THE SLOVENIAN HUNTING CALENDAR

Chamois: from 1st August – 31st December

Alpine ibex: 16th August – 31st December

Mouflon ram : 1st August – 31st December

Fallow buck: 16th August – 31st December

Wild boars: all year round for tuskers.

Brown Bear: usually 1st October – 30th April

Wolf: 1st September-1st February

Red stag: 16th August - 31st December

Roe buck: 1st May – 31st October

N.B. According the value of trophies wished by hunter and the selected hunting area we will suggest the most advisable period.

HUNTING IN SLOVENIA AND HISTORY

From the dawn of human existence, man has been involved in hunting. In the beginning hunting was solely an activity that provided essential food and the warm skins necessary for surviving long hard winters. Deriving from that period – the early Pleistocene Era in fact – you can admire in Slovenian museums the impressive skulls of cave bears. With the social stratification, which began a thousand year or more ago, hunting became the exclusive preserve of the aristocracy. Coming to more recent times, in the mid 19th century state and provincial laws established kill limits and required that hunters acquire licences. Hunters' societies began to reintroduce species that had been driven to extinction in Slovenia as ibexes first, and then red deer. At the close of the century, the first hunting associations were established while the Slovensko Lovsko Društvo (Slovenian Hunting Club), a precursor of the Lovska Zveza Slovenije (Hunters' Association of Slovenia), was itself founded in 1907.

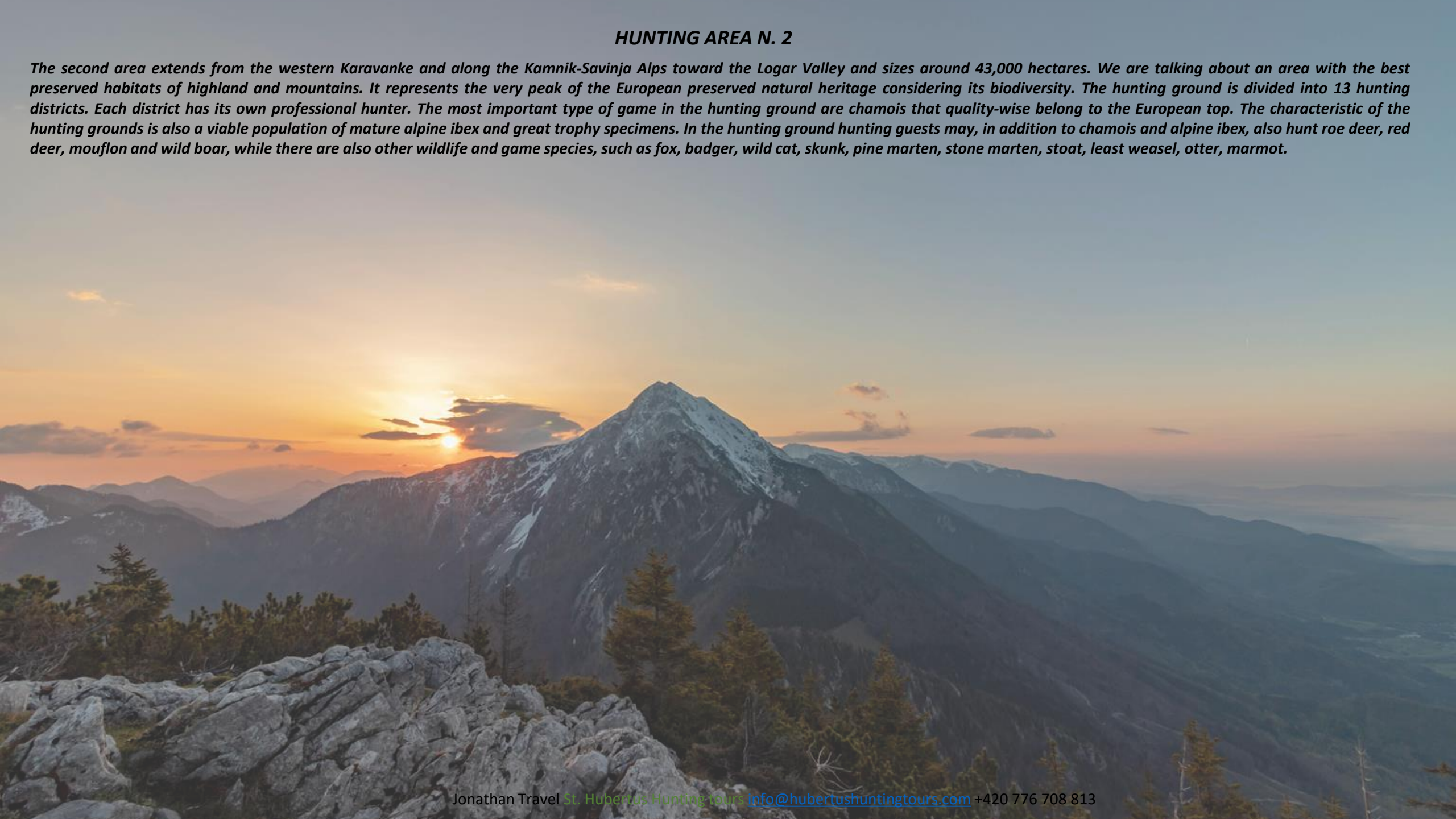


HUNTING AREA N. 1

The first area is located in the north/western part of the Dinaric Alps, just 60 km from Ljubljana. Hunting days are usually arranged in free range sizing totally around 70,000 hectares and/or in two big fenced game reserves, each sizes about 1,000 hectares. The huntable games in free range are red deer, roe deer, wild boar, chamois and brown bear. All three species of large carnivores are constantly present, namely the brown bear, wolf and lynx. It was in this area that lynx was reintroduced in Slovenia. It was one of the most successful repopulations of lynx in Europe, as the lynx from Slovenia populated the entire area of the Dinaric Alps. The hunt for lynx and wolf is forbidden. The two fenced areas have a good population of wild boar (main game), red deer, fallow deer and mouflon.

HUNTING AREA N. 2

The second area extends from the western Karavanke and along the Kamnik-Savinja Alps toward the Logar Valley and sizes around 43,000 hectares. We are talking about an area with the best preserved habitats of highland and mountains. It represents the very peak of the European preserved natural heritage considering its biodiversity. The hunting ground is divided into 13 hunting districts. Each district has its own professional hunter. The most important type of game in the hunting ground are chamois that quality-wise belong to the European top. The characteristic of the hunting grounds is also a viable population of mature alpine ibex and great trophy specimens. In the hunting ground hunting guests may, in addition to chamois and alpine ibex, also hunt roe deer, red deer, mouflon and wild boar, while there are also other wildlife and game species, such as fox, badger, wild cat, skunk, pine marten, stone marten, stoat, least weasel, otter, marmot.

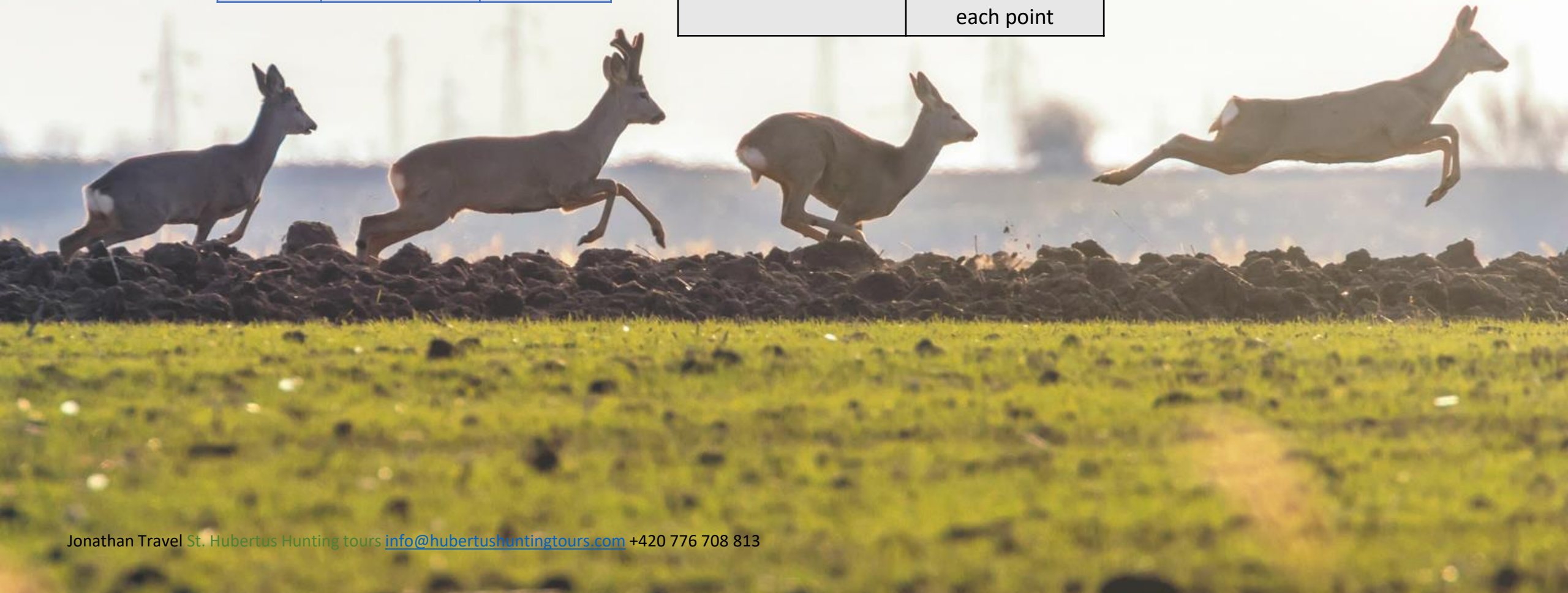

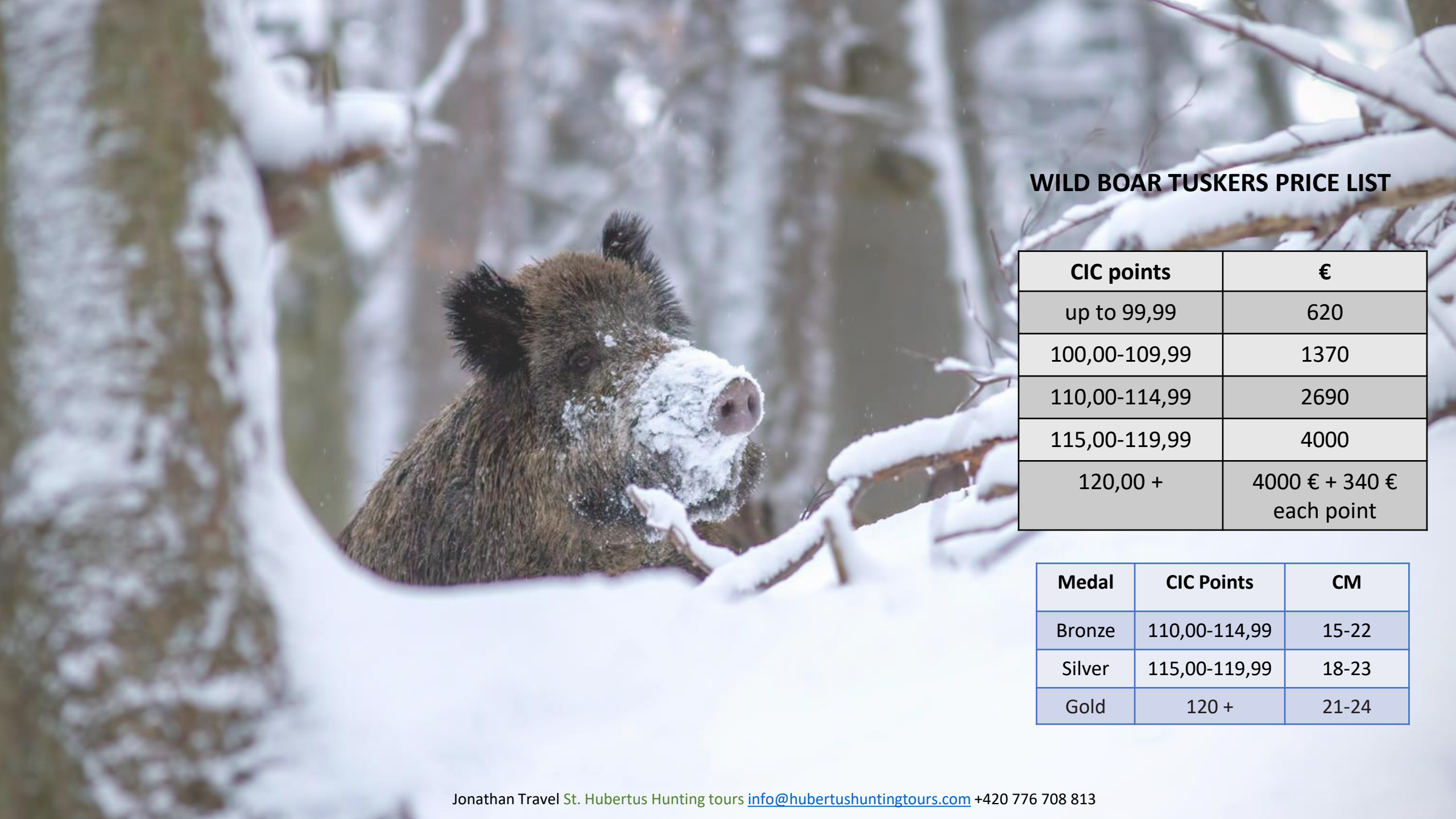

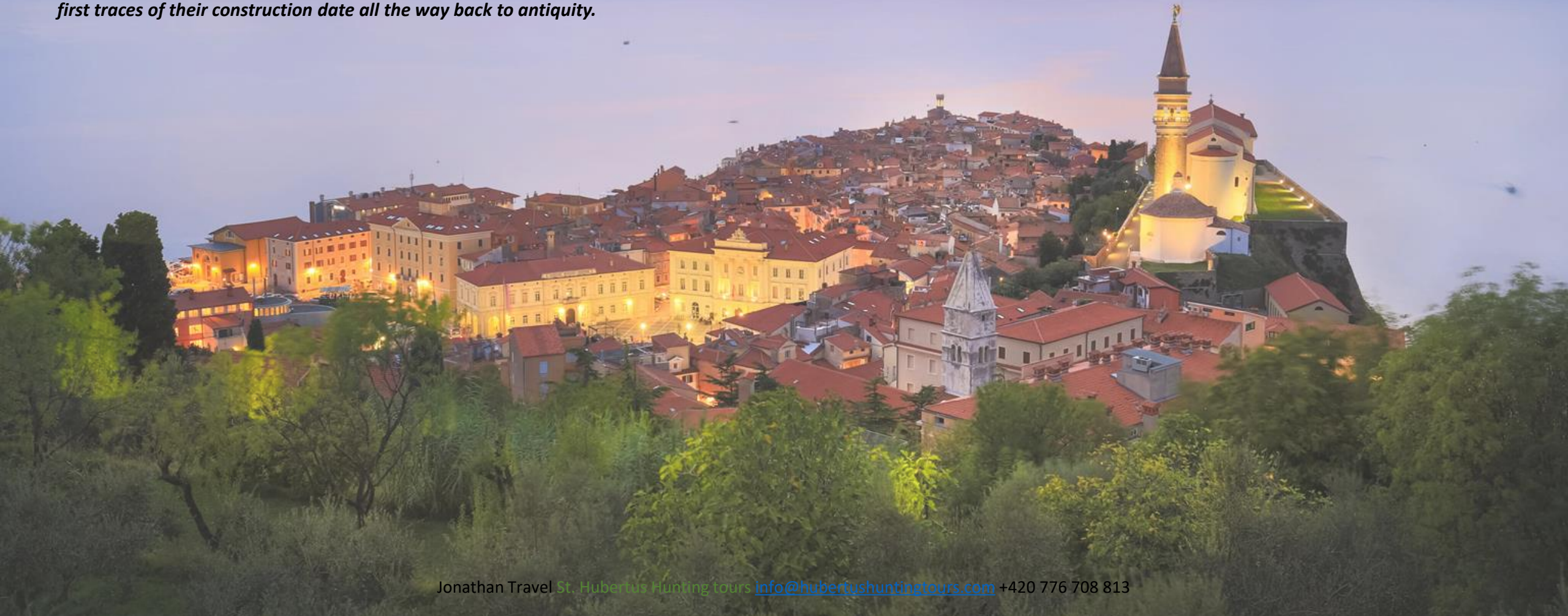
VISIT SLOVENIA

Slovenia, a green country, where the mountains meet the sea and Pannonian Basins. It offers wide green forests and charming towns. You will be surprised how on only 20 271 km² of land there can be such a natural, historical and architectural richness.

Starting from the area the Bled lake where from the lake side you can admire the Alps peaks. On a tiny island in the middle of the lake there is the oldest Slovenian castle dating back to the 1004. As the capital of the Slovenian Alps is considered the town of Kranj with its charming historical center and rich cultural events calendar.

Not to be missed is definitely the capital city, Ljubljana. Given its location it is very similar half to a Mediterranean town and half to Mittel Europe city such as Vienna or Prague. Its history dates back to the Roman empire period when the first village was settled in this area. Second biggest city of Maribor has a "shorter" history when the first written documents are dates to 1204, and both offer charming historical centers and vivid cultural life.

Slovenia is also rich in castles, manors, fortresses, and fortification systems. These were built at various times during the medieval, Renaissance, and Baroque periods, and the first traces of their construction date all the way back to antiquity.



SLOVENIAN GASTRONOMY

Food is an essential part of travel - and that's certainly true of Slovenia. For such a small country the variety of taste for a foodie is incredible. Alpine dishes are a total contrast to those found along the Adriatic coast, while foods in the Karst region and Pannonian Plain offer yet more flavours and cooking techniques. In the summer months there are myriad food festivals and open kitchens celebrating food in all its glory. Slovenia is particularly proud of its indigenous wines, some of which have become part of the protected geographical indication. Look out for teran, refošk, rebula and cviček. The black velvet grapevine (modra kavčina) is officially recognised as being more than 400 years old and is in the Guinness Book of Records as the oldest grapevine in the world, still producing its noble fruit.











BOOKING OF HUNTING STAY/PAYMENT TERMS

Booking of the hunting trip is provided through the advance payment. The amount will be customized for each client based on the specific request.

The remaining payment will be done based on the ordered package and trophy, prior the hunt with bank transfer. At the end of the hunt a final calculation will be done based on the actual trophy hunted and the guest will be either refunded in case of smaller trophy or will be asked to pay the additional amount in case a stronger trophy was hunted.

There will be a written contract with the client with payment conditions. Against the deposit payment we issue a proforma invoice and proper invoice at the end of the hunt.

Note: as we apply direct prices by hunting areas' owners the prices of trophies in this offer are illustrative that means that there may be a difference (usually insignificant) according the concrete area we will select for your hunt.
